The Roses is the traditional lead-up to the \$400,000 Group 1 Queensland Oaks (2400m) on June 2. We wish Lasoron's connections all the best for this race.

In 2001, New Zealand filly Ethereal won the Doomben Roses and Queensland Oaks double.

Guy Walter made it back-to-back Emirates Park Scone Cups with Spy Zaim holding off its rivals to claim the \$110,000 Listed race on a wet track.
